The Team Approach

- Team needs to have an understanding of the Puente model guidelines for student selection, recruitment timeline, and program implementation
- Every school will have different conditions, amount of experience and connections to community
- Teams has the opportunity for making stronger student & parent relationships earlier
- Team contributes to the shaping of the class personality & academic abilities

Factors to consider

01

Create a heterogeneous classroom.

02

The recruitment and selection process requires an investment of time as well cooperation from the feeder school(s).

03

Students selected should represent the demographics of their school site/community.

What Counseling, teaching and leadership **strategies** motivate and encourage that category of student, as well discuss the student's needs.

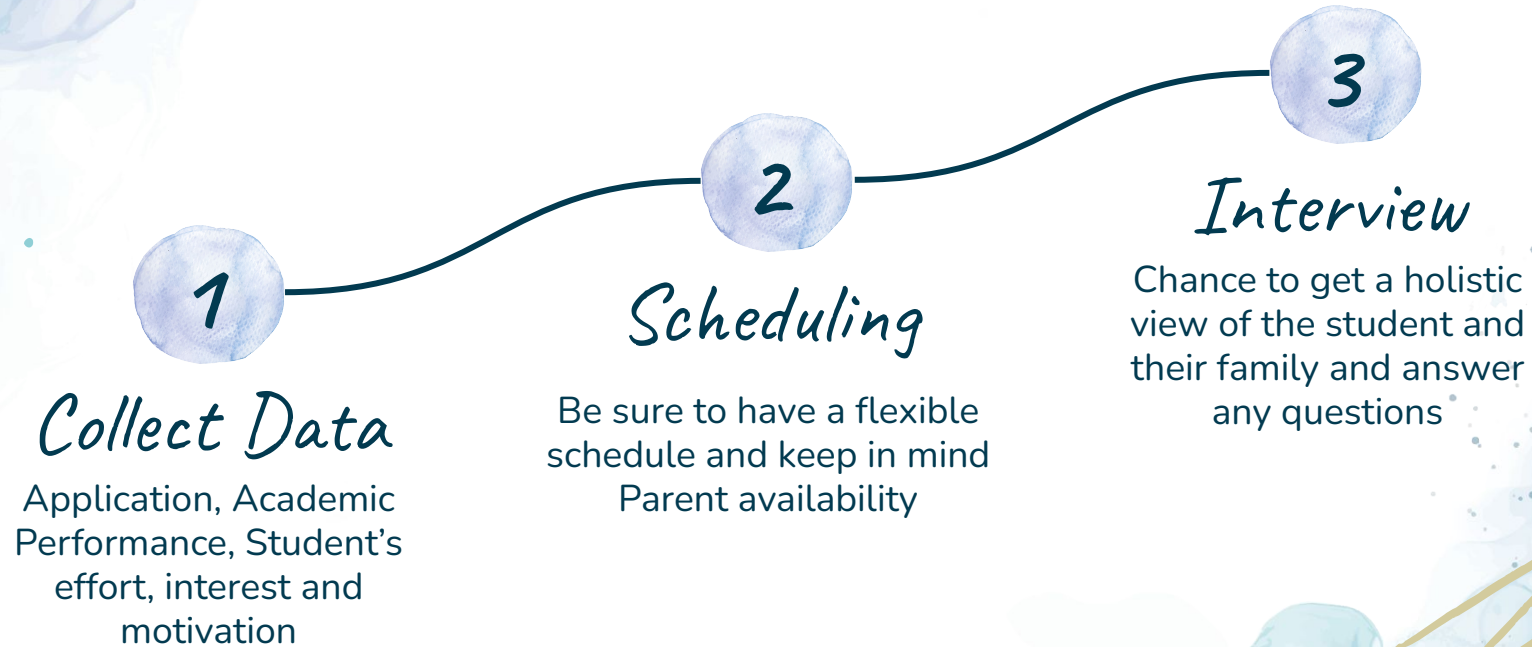

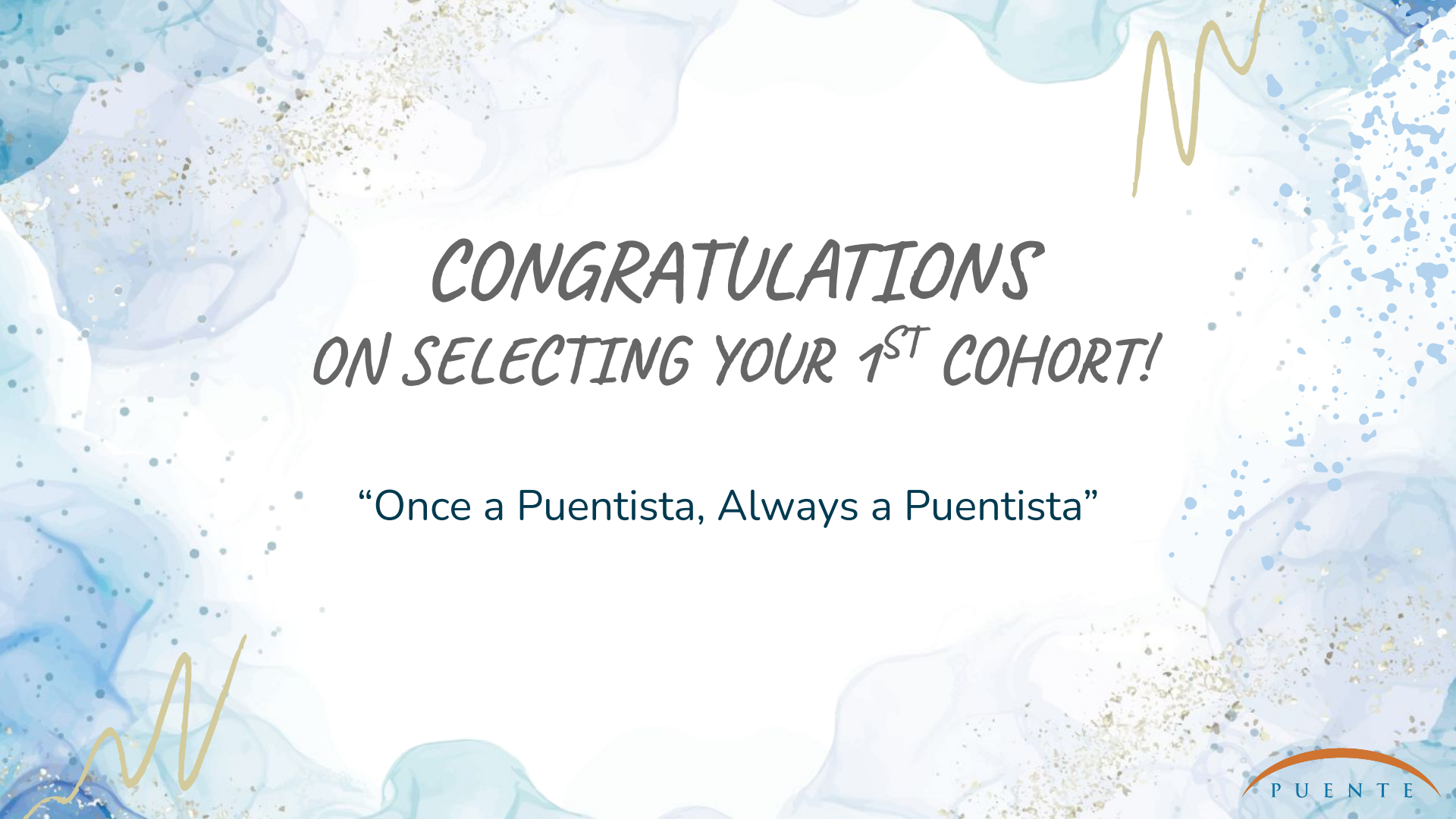
